

Curriculum must lay emphasis on life-long learning

Q. Schools are going to begin in offline mode now. What is your roadmap for this academic session? How are we going to address the "loss of learning issue"?

ANS: The roadmap for the new academic session requires proper meticulous planning, prioritizing and execution on our part to ensure that no body is left behind and all learners are back in school in time. Addressing issues concerning mental well-being of students, providing guidance & counseiling sessions, and psycho-social support is the need of the hour. Tailored and sustained support is needed to help students regain confidence, readjust and catch-up after the pandemic.

Q. What are the changes NEP has brought about and how do you think it will benefit students in the long run?

ANS: The New Education Policy, 2020 makes a clarion call towards a holistic education including multidisciplinary learning, outcome-based curriculum with an emphasis on skill development, entrepreneurship, experiential learning, and interdisciplinary curriculum with an emphasis on learner autonomy. It will help students shift focus away rote learning and will inspire them to go on to understand, paraphraso, analyze, create thus preparing themselves better for future. With a strong focus on equity and inclusivity it will lead to a more meaningful, holistic and liberal education for students to engage into realistically.

Q. What is the kind of value education we want our children to learn from school?

How can that be ensured?

ANS: We want our students to learn, understand and be guided by the nuances

concerning transformative paradigm of learning. The students should be trained to become good human beings endowed with sterling qualities of character. We should train the mindsets of students to exercise a good sense of mental hygiene and stillness of mind. It is equally important for the students to become a responsible and understanding member of the community and society at large. We should also sensitize the mindsets of our students towards various social, moral, ethical and political issues without and prejudice or bias of any kind.



O. What role does extra-curricular play in a student's life. Should schools shift focus towards this since there was a

the pandemic?

ANS: Participation in extra-curricular activities is instrumental in ensuring mental well-being, social aspects of activities, and personality. It is an integral and essential part of curriculum as it helps develop leadership provess.

communication skills, decision making skills, comradery, collaboration, participation, strength, stamina, ability to work in a team setup and develop overall persona ensuring holistic development. It leads to an improved sense of self-esteem, self-discovery, empowerment, self-expression, rebuilding of identity, self-validation, motivation, and a sense of purpose.

Q.Skilling is the buzzword these days. How do you plan to incorporate skilling in your curriculum?

ANS: Skilling is indeed the buzzword these days and developing a right mix of skill sets in the students is absolutely essential. The curriculum should lay emphasis on being life-long learning, prepare students for the real world and develop them as future leaders. It should talk about consistent upskilling and its potential to open plethora of possibilities and generate employment opportunities.

Q. Why is it important for schools to constantly innovate in teaching methodologies?

ANS: Innovation in teaching methodologies is essential to make learning adaptive, inclusive and dynamic. Effective and relevant teaching methodologies can be immensely beneficial when the educators keep experimenting and applying different pedagogical techniques and approaches. It is also essential to keep the children continuously engaged in learning and understanding.

The use of innovative teaching methodologies to assist students and to teach them the benefits of innovative thinking does more than "fill the pail". It helps to kindle the passion for learning and also provides students the necessary tools to succeed.













APRIL 19, 2022 MOCK DRILL





Our mentors exemplified to relieve stress thereby, enhancing mindfulness through a 'Yoga Workshop' for teachers.


